Three affirmative critiques by three judges, selected by the registrar's committee, are required to qualify a prospective candidate as a Saluki and to be entered into the SPDBS studbook. It is not unusual to have additional critiques on file for any particular candidate for the purpose of educating judges, and/or for special cases.

In the event that a candidate Saluki receives a negative judgment(s) the SPDBS Registrar's committee shall:

- 1) Disqualify the candidate Saluki if it receives two or more negative critiques.
- 2) If the candidate Saluki receives one negative critique, then the following steps will be taken:
 - a. The Registrar's committee will organize an additional critique with a long-time breeder who has an established history with country-of-origin Salukis and their descendants.
 - b. The Registrar's committee will obtain SPDBS board approval for the prospective judge. The selected judge will perform the deciding critique.
 - c. This critique will determine if the candidate Saluki qualifies for inclusion in the SPDBS studbook.

Note that all candidate dogs will be evaluated as individuals.
